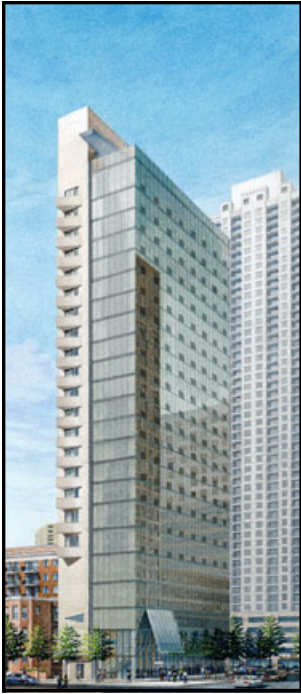

# Dana Hotel & Spa

The Dana Hotel has been around since 1891, when it began as the Erie Hotel. Before closing its doors in 2005, the building held the title as the longest continually operating hotel in Chicago. With the resurgence of Chicago's River North neighborhood comes the new Dana Hotel & Spa.

The building features 26-stories, 216 rooms, and some very unique features. Among them is a rooftop lounge, multi-level sushi bar, and a sidewalk café.

The south face of the structure features exposed concrete walls, leading up to impressive cantilevered triangular balconies. An architectural concrete "rope patterned" wall is exposed on the exterior.

The Dana Hotel & Spa marks Adjustable Forms' first application of an exterior protection system, providing three

levels of fall and weather protection.
